Photography in Open Media Zones

When a school invites parents to an event or when a school hosts a larger event open to community members, this is considered a public event. This means the parents, the public and the media have the right to attend and take photographs because the school has become a public space. The media is expected to behave responsibly and to cooperate with the school.

When a school hosts this type of event, we will put up Open Media Zone posters so that parents and students know that their photo may be taken and shared publicly from this event by other parents, staff, the media and the general public.

Please note that if your child is participating in a school activity that takes place in public, such as at tournaments, games, competitions or other bigger events at a school or outdoors, we are not able to control whether or not your child is photographed.

We want to hear from you!

Last year the school council and the school administration updated the **Personally Owned Electronic Device Policy** and developed a new **Photography and Privacy Policy**. These policies are intended to guide the use of personal devices at school and clarify roles and responsibilities of all members of the school community when it comes to taking and sharing photos of students. We have reviewed these draft policies with teachers and the Department of Education.

DRAFT PHOTOGRAPHY AND PRIVACY POLICY

Privacy laws require that we protect the safety and privacy of students and their information, including photos, videos, interviews of the student and any “student work”, i.e. the assignments that students create as part of their school work such as essays, presentations, crafts, etc. Please note that any student information that appears online (e.g. on a school website) is considered to be issued to the public.

Schools must obtain permission from the parents/guardians to share any student information. If the consent is not provided, the student’s information (photo, interview, projects) cannot be posted online or shared with the media.

Roles and Responsibilities

Staff and School Council: Parents/guardians provide permission to use or share their child’s image and information to promote school programs at the start of the school year through the Department of Education consent form. If a parent/guardian has not provided consent or has not returned the form, photos or videos of that child are not permitted to be taken during school programs.

Students: In class students may use electronic devices provided by the school as part of their supervised classroom activities. Personally owned electronic devices are not permitted in class unless specifically sanctioned by the teacher for a class or event. Students must check with teachers and their friends and classmates before they share or post photos or information about other kids that they have taken at school (e.g. sharing a photo taken in class on Snapchat or quoting a friend on Tumblr).

Parents/Guardians: Parents must check with staff and other parents/guardians before sharing or posting photos or information about students during school programs (e.g. posting a photo of your child with classmates on Facebook). Parents are expected to check with the teacher before taking photos in the classroom.

Media: When the media is invited to visit a school program, the staff will make sure we have the parents/guardians permission for those children to be photographed, interviewed, or videotaped. Students will not be photographed, interviewed, or videoed without parent/guardian permission.

Public events at the school

A public event occurs when parents/guardians are invited to the school for an event or when the school hosts an event open to community members. During a public event, parents/guardians, the public, and the media have the right to attend and take photographs as the school has become a public space. The media is expected to behave responsibly and to cooperate with the school.

At a public event, we will post Open Media Zone posters to advise parents/guardians and students





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that their photo from the event may be taken and shared publicly by other parents/guardians, staff, the media and the public. If your child is participating in a public event at the school we are not able to control whether or not your child is photographed.

At all events at our school we expect parents/guardians, staff, and the media to model responsible and respectful use of electronic devices.

DRAFT PERSONALLY OWNED ELECTRONIC DEVICE USE POLICY

At Golden Horn Elementary School, one way we encourage healthy social interaction and active play is through eliminating the use of personally owned electronic devices during school hours or at school events. Golden Horn students use electronic devices provided by the school as part of their supervised classroom activities and the responsible use of these devices is part of their learning experience.

The following personally owned electronic devices are included under this policy:

- iPods;
- Hand held games;
- Tablets;
- Cell phones; and/or
- Digital cameras

Personally owned electronic devices may be used:

- On the bus to and from school; and
- On school trips longer than one hour **if** permitted by the teacher(s).

Personally owned electronic devices may not be used during school hours, including:

- After getting off the bus in the morning;
- Before getting on the bus at the end of the school day;
- Morning recess;
- Noon recess;
- Lunch time; and/or
- Class time.

Devices must be stored in the student's locker or backpack. If students are uncomfortable leaving their devices in their backpack, they can be left at the office for safe keeping.

Misuse of personally owned electronic devices:

If students misuse an electronic device it will be confiscated by a staff member.

- First misuse: the item will be taken to the office and may be collected by the student at the end of the day.
- Subsequent misuse: the item will be taken to the office and must be collected by a parent or guardian.
- Chronic misuse: the student will not be allowed to have the item at school.

We believe staff and parents/guardians play an important role in modelling the responsible use of personally owned electronic devices while participating in school events. As such staff, parents/guardians are encouraged to limit the use of personally owned electronic devices at school or at school events to activities that support educational programs and/or for emergency purposes.

WE'RE NIT PICKING AGAIN!

Fall and the return to school bring children back into close contact again and with that come the possibility of the spread of head lice. Head lice are tiny insects that live on warm heads. They do not spread disease, however it can be a nuisance and uncomfortable when they decide to take up residence on *your* head!

Head lice can be spread by close head to head contact and sharing items that have been in contact with a head that has head lice. They do not jump or fly.

Head lice should only be treated if you identify live lice on your head. The goal of the treatment is to kill the live lice.



Some treatments also work to prevent the hatching of any eggs the lice have laid, also known as nits. However, the most effective way of preventing the hatching of eggs is to physically remove all of the nits. This is time consuming, yes, but really the only effective way of ending the life cycle of the lice. We need to get nit picking!

If you think your child may have head lice, check their head for live lice. Remember they move fast so you'll need to look closely with good lighting. Especially check at the hairline at the neck and behind the ears.

If you identify that your child has head lice, please speak to your pharmacist and check out this website for further advice about how to treat it.

You can help prevent the spread of head lice by teaching your child to avoid head to head

contact with other children and not to share combs, brushes, hair ornaments, and hats.

Whitehorse Health Centre nurses recommend that parents check their children's heads weekly to help you identify head lice as soon as possible. If you do identify head lice, please remember that they are just as happy living on a nice clean warm head as on a dirty one. This is no reflection on your family's hygiene. However, if you let the school know that your child has head lice, they will be able to notify the other parents in your child's class so they can be sure to check their child's head more frequently.

They also do **not** recommend that your child be excluded from school because head lice are common and do not spread disease. It is important for your child to be present at school to maximize their learning - especially at the beginning of the school year.
